Reading Isaiah you see the picture of Jesus emerge. Color some highlights from the book of Isaiah.


- Isaiah 7: A son shall be born and will be named Immanuel

Read Isaiah 52:13-53:12


Write words that describe Jesus, what he will do, and how do people respond to him.



Read two verses from Isaiah 53 and talk about what they mean as a family.


Isaiah 53:5
